

MAKEUP MINIMALISM

Beauty buys that keep you looking like, well, you.

FOR BRIDES WHO DON'T normally wear a lot of makeup, putting together a wedding day look can be intimidating. But we're here to help! We asked some of the city's top makeup artists for favorite products and helpful tips to keep you looking fresh and natural on your big day, but most importantly, keep you looking like yourself.



PREP

"It's all about healthy, dewy skin," say styling, makeup, and hair experts Sam Lewis and Megan Levy of Lewis & Levy. To achieve this, they recommend cleansing and then moisturizing with a mild facial lotion or a primer like Glossier's priming moisturizer.



CHEEKS

"My motto is K.I.S.S.—a.k.a. Keep It Simple Sweetheart," says wedding hair and makeup expert Kirstie Wight. Her cheeky go-to for a natural flush? Stila's Convertible cream cheek color. "It's so easy to use and apply—just dot on the apples of your cheeks with your fingers and gently pat in," Wight says. "Plus, you can also swipe a little on your lips to give them a quick tint."

Lewis & Levy are fans of cheek stains by Tarte and the Cloud Paint line of cream blushes by Glossier. "For warmer skin tones, we recommend Natural Beauty Cheek Stain by Tarte, or Beam and Puff Cloud Paints," the duo notes. "For cooler tones, go with Flush by Tarte or Haze Cloud Paint."



HIGHLIGHTER

To create a luminescent glow, Lewis & Levy reach for Glossier's Halo-Scope highlighter, or a sweep of sheer bronzer (the duo loves Clinique's True Bronzer) around the hairline, cheeks, and jawline.

BROWS

For brides who like an enhanced natural brow, Lewis & Levy love Boy Brow by Glossier. "Use small, light strokes at first for full brows, and finish by smoothing them out or combing upward." For a more structured brow, the duo reaches for a combination pencil/gel, like the Natural Brow Duo by Pixi.

For her clients, Wight uses the Diorshow Brow Styler brow pencil in Universal Brown. "It's a brilliant shade that works on most people who want a subtle bit of color in their brows," she says. "I love that it gives such a fine hair-like definition, and it comes with a spoolie on the other end of the pencil to comb your brows once you're done filling them in."



LIP

In a color called Diva, you know this matte lipstick from MAC means business. Its rich shade of deep, plummy red can easily be built upon for less or more color, and either left solo for a matte finish, or topped with a clear gloss for a shimmery sheen.

SETTING SPRAY

Finish off your bridal beauty look with a quick spritz of a setting spray, like Glow Mist by Pixi (Lewis & Levy name it as a favorite) or Portland's own Onya's sweet rose hydrating face mist. Spritz generously throughout the day to maintain your fresh, glowing look.
